Presenters Bio:graphy:

Penny Bernath is the Education Director of South Florida PBS. She has contributed to the station's success with the creation of KidVision PreK, an online professional development program for preschool teachers. Penny started her early childhood career as an active parent in the preschool program at Nova Southeastern University (NSU) where she enrolled her children. She soon became a preschool teacher aide, then a teacher, a director, and eventually taught teachers how to teach preschool at NSU teaching National Child Development Associate (CDA) classes. She continued to grow professionally going out into the community developing and presenting professional development trainings for NSU, helping failing preschools with on-going training and mentoring.

Penny took this combined work and teaching knowledge to develop KidVisionPreK.org, knowing that preschool teachers needed practical standards training in a format that was easy for them to understand and apply in the classroom. KidVision PreK field trips can be matched to any curriculum, enriching it with audio-visual content and hands-on standards-based activities. Penny has a Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education, a master's in early childhood education, and a specialist degree in educational leadership. She has a State of Florida professional teaching certificate for ages 3 to grade 6. Penny is certified in Music Together, Teaching Strategies Gold, and CLASS.




Session Description:

Following his experiences in the classroom, Keith moved on to teach at the University of Central Florida in Orlando, Florida, and he also was an Assistant Professor of Early Childhood Education at Gordon College in Wenham, Massachusetts.

Along with his classroom experience and writing, Keith has been involved in a variety of research and hands-on programs—specifically regarding play therapy and play as a strategy for the development of cognitive processes. Keith was a founding member—along with Becky Bailey (Loving Guidance/Conscious Discipline), Pam Frank (psychologist/play therapist), and other teachers, counselors, and early childhood specialists—of Project Play, a developmental, play therapy-based, and behavior intervention program that worked with young children who may have difficulties developmentally, cognitively, or socially and emotionally.


