Early Childhood Education providers that are contracted with ELCPH are required to complete these developmental screens for all School Readiness children's ages 0-5. It is essentials that all early educators know and understand the process. This two hour training is split into two parts, and it will give you the information needed in order to successfully complete and utilize both the ASQ-3 and ASQ-SE2.
