

VPK Teacher Learning Circle Hillsborough, Pinellas, Pasco, or Hernando Counties Spring 2025

The University of South Florida College of Education in partnership with the Florida Office of Early Learning and the Tampa Bay History Center will be hosting a Learning Circle - a free, peerengaged experience for VPK teachers. The Learning Circle will provide strategies and resources to foster preschoolers' exploratory learning and play-based inquiry using interdisciplinary activities that include community-based historical photographs from the Tampa Bay region that support Florida's Early Learning and Developmental Standards (2017).

This exciting opportunity offers you not only professional development, but also participating teachers will earn a stipend (\$400) upon successful completion. To be eligible, you must be employed as a VPK instructor at a school that maintains a VPK contract with an early learning coalition in one of the following counties: Hillsborough, Pinellas, Pasco, or Hernando.

Each session, we will meet for approximately 90 minutes to engage in activities that allow you to explore a teaching strategy along with learning resources. We will then work collaboratively to practice new skills and reflect on how to apply these approaches into VPK classrooms. You will have opportunities to share new ideas and strategies, network with other early childhood professionals, share resources and experiences, and brainstorm solutions to challenges you may have encountered.

The Circle will run from 6 pm to 7:30 pm on the following dates: January 14, January 28, February 11, March 4, March 25, and April 15. All sessions will be delivered via Zoom. Participation is limited to 18 VPK teachers, so please complete your application form as soon as possible.
