Celebrating Holidays Together: Honoring Traditions and Building Understanding

Preschool is the perfect place for children to begin learning about the many ways families celebrate holidays. Seeing their own traditions reflected in the classroom - alongside those of others - helps children feel proud of who they are while learning to respect and appreciate differences. Research shows that learning about a variety of traditions early on helps children grow in empathy and social skills (NAEYC, 2019).

At school, holiday celebrations go beyond decorating for just one season or event. Teachers may introduce traditions such as Diwali, Lunar New Year, Hanukkah, Christmas, Eid al-Fitr, Kwanzaa, or even special family traditions unique to each family. Children might listen to stories, sing songs, try crafts, or taste foods connected to these holidays. When families share their own customs—like bringing in a favorite recipe, sharing photos, or teaching a song—it not only excites the children but also helps build a stronger classroom community.



You can continue the conversation at home by using simple phrases with your child, such as, "Some families light candles for this holiday," or "This family celebrates with a special meal." This helps children make connections without feeling that one way of celebrating is more important than another.

By celebrating many traditions throughout the year, we show children that every culture has something meaningful to offer. As parents, your voice and participation make these experiences even richer and help children grow into curious, respectful learners who value the world around them.




Read Together, Learn Together





As fall and winter arrive, families are given some of the best opportunities for engagement through traditions. Whether it is a special recipe, decorating, storytelling, or community events, traditions are an excellent way to help children feel connected, supported, and excited to learn.

When families share traditions with their children, they are opening doors to conversations, memories, and learning experiences. A child who listens to Grandma

These shared moments help children understand who they are and how they belong within their family and community.

VPK Provider Ratings & Designations
The Florida Department of Education has released the performance ratings and designations for all Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) providers for the 2024–2025 school year. This is the first year ratings are part of Florida's new VPK accountability system.

How Providers Are Rated

Each VPK provider receives a score based on three important factors:

- 50% Program Quality Measured by classroom interactions (CLASS assessment)
- 20% Student Achievement percentage of children scoring "kindergarten-ready" on the PM3 assessment
- 30% Student Learning Gains Growth from PM1 to PM3 assessment scores

Parents learn to recognize these signals, and respond in ways that nurture the child's sense of security. This secure foundation allows children to grow more confident, develop healthy relationships, and manage their emotions more effectively.
